PAC Meeting: Principal's Update – Sept. 20, 2018

Information and things we're proud of since the last PAC meeting...

ENROLLMENT, STAFFING and SERVICES:

• 246 students enrolled (last year was 253 at the end of the year)...34 new students to Montecito not including the Ks; a large group of Grade 7s as well as 19 other students transferred to other schools, districts, countries and programs such as MACC and late French Immersion...

• 11 Divisions...see below for details. The organization of classes this year was driven by

numbers and class composition needs.

- **Class size limits:** K or classes with K class size limits are 20, Primary classes and 3/4 classes with more Grade 3s have a limit of 22, Grade 3/4 classes with more Grade 4s have a class size limit of 24, and Intermediate classes have a limit of 30.
- We currently have 31 students with designations, the majority are in the intermediate grades this year. We have 6.5 EAs.
- We have 72 ELL students including 13 International students. Ms. Parsonson is 0.85 teaching ELL.
- LSS support is 1.20 plus 0.4 Reading Recovery for Grade 1s. Ms. Foy is doing 0.2 Reading Recovery, 0.4 LSS, 0.3 Div. 5 classroom teacher and 0.1 NIS/International. Ms. Wood is 0.2 Reading recovery and 0.8 LSS.
- Ms. Vaughan has been given 0.1 (145 minutes a week) as an Indigenous Inquiry Learning
 Teacher. Her role will be to support Indigenous students and teachers. We have 16 Indigenous
 students at Montecito.
- Mrs. Ingham is our counsellor Mondays and Wednesdays, and Winnie Yip is our SLP (speech language pathologist) on Tuesdays.

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OTHER:

- First Week theme was Kindness to Ourselves at Montecito...we focused on sleep, nutrition, exercise, problem solving using our WITS, Zones of Regulation, growth mindset and creating a positive self-image.
- Student Leadership opportunities have started for Grade 4-7 students (classroom monitors, office monitors, safety patrol...)
- Mrs. Chin and Mrs. Vaughan have started Cross Country for Grades 4-7 students

UPDATED Wishlist Suggestions for the Montecito PAC 2018/19

In approximate order of priority at this time...updated Sept. 2018

- Fieldtrip/Workshop Money: Bus money or ability to use the money for inschool workshops e.g.) nutrition, ADST, Science... (\$450 x 11 divisions = \$4950) ...note: bus costs have gone up this year not sure of exact amount yet
- \$150 consumables per division plus Music, LSS, ELL and shared Library/Counselling (15 x \$150= \$2250)
- Ultimate Frisbee for Grade 1-7 students first two weeks of school (\$2100)
- Buses for whole school skating fieldtrip (\$850.50)
- Another projector (\$2100)...location TBD (gym or classroom)
- 20 more jerseys (20 x \$29 = 580 plus tx= \$660)
- Forks, spoons, plates, tablecloths, teacups for school event use (\$1000)
- Another cordless mic (\$500) or comes with sound system???
- Pal Patrol and noon hour program materials (\$100)
- Board games ($$50 \times 11 \text{ divisions} = 550)
- ½ cost of whole school fieldtrip??? (\$1125)

Total ask = \$1	6,185.5	0
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Other considerations?

- sound system and projector for the gym (\$12,000)...would put the projector in the gym if this was approved (plus no need for an extra mic as would come with the system)...this is a big ticket item that the majority of staff want so would be high on the priority list
- a new coffee maker for the staffroom

Next year...

- Money towards a whole school drum-making project (materials and possibly a resident artist to come in) (\$5000???) ...apply for an Art Starts grant as well
- A couple of rock tables and benches (3 benches and a table = approx.
 \$2000)
