Information and things we're proud of since the last PAC meeting...

- Literacy Week variety of reading, writing and oral language activities both at school and home; Hall #4 Firefighters visited Div. 9-11. Division 11 repaid their visit with an act of kindness! They made and delivered cookies to the hall.
- New International student orientation we welcomed three new International students at the end of January and now have 15 International students as part of our community.
