
How can you regularly help to develop literacy skills at home? Reading is one of the most important skills a child can learn. Prioritizing time to read at home every night has huge benefits, and helps your children build confidence and competence as readers. Asking questions helps to develop their thinking skills or comprehension. Please refer to some helpful prompts in the image to the right. Promoting reading at home daily and working in partnership with your child's teacher, we can develop literacy skills and foster a love of reading that will hopefully last a lifetime!

Here are some questions you can ask your children during their daily home reading to engage in conversation with your child and build their thinking and comprehension skills

<u>Before reading:</u>

-Looking at the title, cover and illustrations/pictures, what do you think will happen in this book? Why do you think this? -What characters do you think might be in the book? -Do you think there will be problem in the story? What could the problem be? -What do you already know about the topic of this book? -Does the topic or story relate to you or your family? How? -Do you think it will be like any other book you've read? If so, which one, and how do you think it will be similar?

During reading:

-What has happened so far in the story? Can you tell me using sequence words? (first, then, next, finally, etc.)
-What do you predict will happen next? Why?
-How do you think the story will end? Why?
-Why do you think the character did ______?
-What would you have done if you were the character?
-How would you have felt if you were the character?
-When you read, what pictures did you see in your head?
-What are you wondering about as you read? What questions do you have?
-Think about the predictions you made before reading; do you still think the story will go that way? Why or why not? How do you think it will go now?

After reading:

-Why is the title a good title for the book/story? If you had to give it a different title, what would be another good title for it?

-Were your predictions correct? Where did you have to fix your prediction as you read?

-If there was a problem, did it get solved? How did the character try to solve the problem?

-Did any of the characters change through the story? Who changed, and how did they change?

-Why do you think the author wrote this book?

-What is the most important point that the author is trying to make in his/her writing?

- -What was your favourite part? Why?
- -If you could change one part, what would you change? Why?
- -If you could ask the author a question, what would you ask?

-Can you retell the story in sequence order (use sequence words: first, second, then, next, etc.)?

-Is there a character in the story that reminds you of someone you know? If so, who are they like, and why do you think that?

-Does this book remind you of another book you know? Does it remind you of something you've experienced in real life?

For fun: Have your child act out a scene from the book, draw you a picture of their favourite part, or write a follow-up story or new ending to the story. Your child can pretend they are a book reviewer reviewing the book on TV, or they can write a letter or postcard to the author or a character. There are many creative ways to engage your child in reading and have him/her share their reading with you!

FEBRUARY IS REGISTRATION MONTH

BURNABY SCHOOL DISTRICT REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

- February is registration month for children born in 2016 for Kindergarten starting in September 2021.
- Registrations for this year will be done online at the at the Burnaby District Website
- https://burnabyschools.ca/registration/

A list of required documents is included below to assist you.

- 1. Students must reside with their parents or legal guardian.
- 2. Proof of birth date for the student (birth certificate or passport)
- 3. **Proof of guardianship** (parents' or guardians' as shown on birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation such as landed immigrant paper or guardianship order). Note that a notarized custodial guardian appointment is not the same as a guardianship order granted by the courts.
- 4. **Proof of citizenship for both the parent and the student** (Canadian birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card).
- 5. Proof of residency of the parent or guardian and student: This must include TWO items, AT LEAST ONE being from Category A below:

i.<u>Category A:</u> proof of ownership of dwelling or long-term lease or rental of dwelling; legal documents indicating BC residence; parent or guardian filing income tax returns as a BC resident

ii. <u>Category B:</u> BC Hydro bill, BC cable bill, Provincial driver's licence, provincial registration of automobile, Canadian bank accounts or credit cards

6. Immunization Records

- 7. Care Card/Personal Health Number
- 8. A completed Burnaby School District Student Information Form (registration form)
- **9.** A completed **Burnaby School District Medical Information Form.** Note: Severe health concerns require additional forms. These can be obtained from the school that you are applying to attend.
- 10. Copy of the student's most recent school marks (including summer school), such as:
 - a. An official copy of marks from the student's Permanent Record Card; or
 - b. The student's most recent report card; or
 - c. A transcript of academic record; or
 - d. A transfer form with marks
- 11. An emergency telephone contact number of a local person who is available during school hours

12. The name and telephone number of the family doctor or medical clinic

CROSS DISTRICT, OUT-OF-DISTRICT AND DISTRICT LANGUAGE PROGRAM APPLICATIONS:

- If you <u>do not</u> live in our catchment area and are applying to attend Montecito School, you MUST first register online at your attendance area (catchment) school. A CROSS-DISTRICT application form must accompany the registration form and MUST be signed by the school principal at your catchment school. The catchment area school will then forward the applicable form(s) to the other appropriate school(s).
- Students living outside of Burnaby can apply to attend a Burnaby school by submitting an OUT-OF-DISTRICT form.
 - All CROSS-DISTRICT and OUT-OF-DISTRICT applications submitted <u>ON TIME</u> will be reviewed by the school district and you will be notified of their decision by March 31. Applications submitted within the established timelines (Feb. 1 – 25) are considered first. <u>https://burnabyschools.ca/cross-district-transfer/</u>

STUDENTS GOING INTO GRADE 8

Current Grade 7 students residing in Burnaby have automatically been registered for Grade 8 at the secondary school within the designated attendance area where the student resides. Current Grade 7 students who do not reside in the attendance area for the secondary school they wish to attend must submit a Cross-district or Out-of-district Transfer Application in order to be considered for admission to that secondary school. IMPORTANT REMINERS FOR OUR MONTECITO FAMILIES!

Doorbell Expectations:

Kindly review the following information with you child(ren):

The doorbell is only to be used when there is no one outside who is able to let you in the building and it is necessary that you enter.

In the morning- If you arrive late and there are no staff outside to let you in, please ring the doorbell.

If you arrive late and there is still a class outside, you do not need to ring the doorbell. Approach the teacher who is still outside and make sure you answer the health check questions and have your hands sprayed. Please stop by the office once you are inside to sign in and receive a welcome rock.

During recess and lunch- ask a supervisor to let you in to use the washroom. You do not need to ring the doorbell.

End of the day- Do you need to go to the washroom first? Do you have all your belongings? Try to take care of these things **before** exiting the school.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS INFORMATION

PLEASE NOTIFY THE OFFICE & PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION

If you have a change of address, please provide the following original documents to the office so that photocopies can be made to update your child's file.

Proof of residence of the parent or guardian and student. This must include two items, at least one being from Category A below:

- <u>Category A</u>: proof of ownership of dwelling or long-term lease or rental of dwelling; legal documents indicating BC residence; parent or guardian filing income tax returns as a BC resident
- <u>Category B</u>: BC Hydro bill, BC cable bill, Provincial driver's licence, provincial registration of automobile, Canadian bank accounts or credit cards

Quest for Rest

Montecito is one of 4 schools in Burnaby to be piloting the Quest for Rest sleep hygiene program. Children learn and understand how healthy sleep gives them an important "power-up" for their emotional, physical, and mental development. It's catered for K-2 age group and the curriculum is built around the book, "The Quest for Rest: Polly & Pickles." Each lesson includes a take-home package that summarizes the school activity and provides a follow-up activity to be completed by the parents and students.


PARKING REMINDER AND SAFETY AT MONTECITO:

For the safety of our children at Montecito, please obey the posted traffic signs indicating where parking is allowed and where it is not. We have provided a map below to provide a visual reminder. You can STOP in a 'No parking' zone...you just can't get out of your car. You CANNOT stop in a 'no stopping' zone. Also, we have had cars parking close to the crosswalks, and this makes visibility extremely hard.

If you have any concerns or questions, please feel free to contact me at the school. Let's all work together to ensure safety of Montecito students.

Vehicle Key:

- Red = 'NO STOPPING' Zone stay away from these areas please
- Blue = 'No Parking' Zone you can stop but remain in your vehicle
- Yellow = '5 minute drop off' for quick drop off and pick up
- Green = parking available



REMINDER: There is no bad weather.... only inappropriate clothing!

We are lucky to live in a relatively moderate climate. However, some days will be wet and some days will be cold. What matters is that we all learn to dress appropriately for outdoor activities no matter the weather.


Outdoor play is valuable and fresh air is healthy. Our students have two opportunities daily to be outside (recess and lunch) as well as times planned by teachers throughout the week. We believe in outdoor play and education, and encourage students to enjoy their natural environment.

Encourage your children to play in the rain and snow, as much can be learned. Jump in or toss stones in puddles and observe the splash and ripples. Why do rocks and stones look so much more interesting when they are wet? How can water be made to flow from one puddle to another? What kind of mud makes the best mud pancakes? Notice the ice patterns that form on puddles when the temperature drops. Build forts with snow. What kind of snow is the best for tobogganing?

As we are in the rainy, cold season please be sure your child has:

On a Rainy Day:

- Waterproof hat
- Waterproof jacket • Waterproof boots
- Waterproof pants
- Umbrella



• Change of clothes

On a Snowy Day:

- Toque that covers ears Heavy jacket for warmth Snow Pants
- Snow boots

- Change of clothes
- Warm socks Insulated gloves or mittens suitable for handling snow

***It would be helpful for all students to have a change of clothes at school, should they slip or get soaking wet. This will help them so that they are not uncomfortable in wet clothes during class time.


