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## PAC Meeting: Principal's Update - October 19, 2021

## Notes, information and things we're proud of since the last PAC meeting...

- Health and Safety- our first evacuation drill went very smoothly. In the coming weeks we will be updating our emergency preparedness information and may require some parent assistance
- We held Class Reviews this week where every classroom teacher met with the school team of admin, LSS teachers, ELL teacher, and Counsellor to discuss classroom strengths and challenges. This information helps us plan our supports in LSS, ELL and counselling for both individual students and classes.
- September Pro-D: The majority of our day was spent exploring ways to refine both our numeracy goal as well as reviewing our Indigenous Annual Plan.
- Terry Fox run- Everyone ran, jogged or walked across Canada multiple times on the field, passing each of the provinces on Terry's planned route and collecting stamps along the way on their personal maps of Canada. Montecito rose to the challenge and surpassed our initial \$550 school goal to reach an astounding \$1371.00 for the Terry Fox Foundation!

### **PAC REQUESTS 2021 2022**

- Recurring line items: Fieldtrip/Workshop Money- Ability to use the money for inschool workshops e.g.) ADST, Science, S.S., mental health, digital citizenship, etc. (\$450 x 10 divisions = \$4500)
- \$150 consumables per division plus Music, LSS, ELL and shared Library/Counselling (14 x \$150= **\$2100**)
